Board Mid Year Update

As we reach the middle of the academic year, the Board would like to acknowledge our teaching staff for the professional way they have responded to the ongoing changes introduced by the Ministry of Education. With raised expectations for student achievement and the implementation of a new curriculum, some variation in achievement data is expected across the country. However, our staff continue to engage in professional development and are managing these changes with confidence and diligence.

We are very pleased with the new canopy and artificial turf, funded by the Board. It is great to see these facilities already being well used, with sports practices and physical education continuing even during wet weather. The installation of air conditioning in Rooms 9 to 12 has also made a positive difference for both students and staff.

Looking ahead, our next project is the development of a middle school playground, which is currently in the tender process. This will be funded through hall hire, PTA contributions, and international student fees. In addition, the Board has partnered with the Ministry of Education to carry out further improvements across the school, including upgrades to classroom spaces and facilities.

We have also increased teacher aide and teaching support this year to better meet the needs of our students. Parent donations continue to play an important role in providing both support and extension programmes, and we sincerely appreciate the ongoing support from our families.

On behalf of the Board, thank you very much for your continued commitment to our school community.

Year 3 Watercare Education Visit

This week, our Year 3 students from M1 and M2 enjoyed a visit from a Watercare educator. They learned about freshwater insects and how these creatures can tell us about the health of our streams. Students discovered that different insects are indicators of water quality and explored ways we can help protect our freshwater environments. This learning linked closely to our inquiry into caring for our local environment and understanding the importance of healthy waterways. It was especially exciting to have live freshwater invertebrates in our classrooms!

M3 students are looking forward to their Watercare session in Week 11.

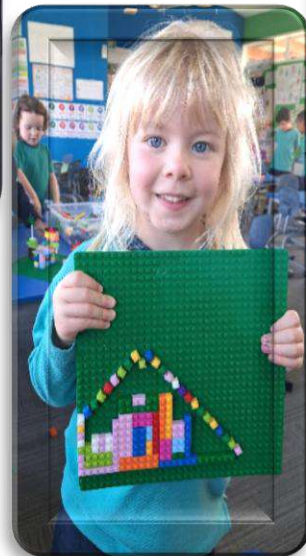


From the Spanish Classroom - Spanish Comes Alive!

This week, St Thomas's School News (STS News) celebrates an exciting milestone - our **50th episode!**

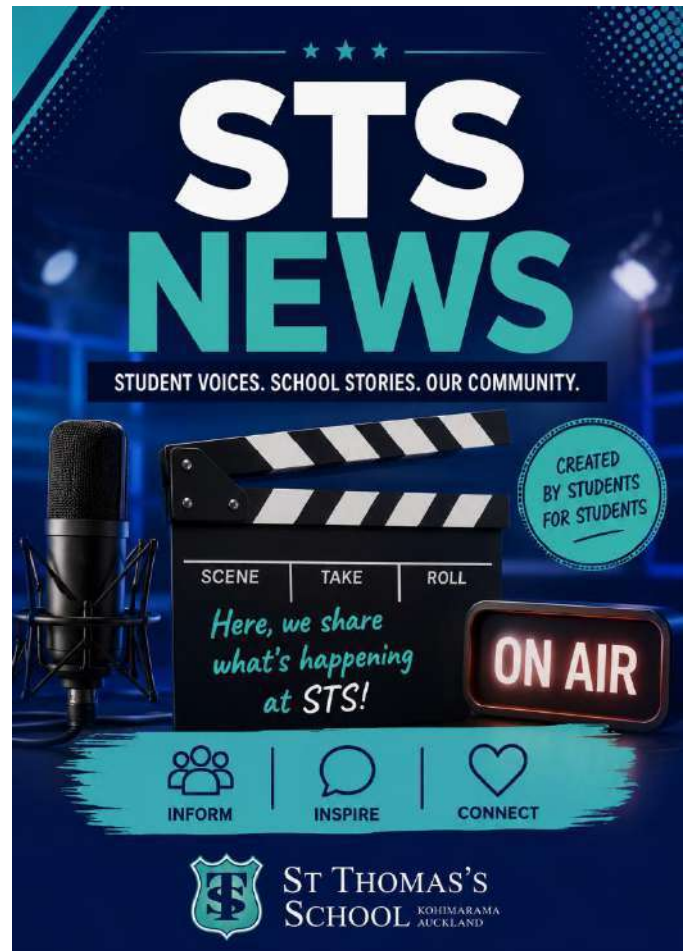

A huge congratulations to all the students who have contributed to making the first 50 episodes such a success. Here's to the next 50!

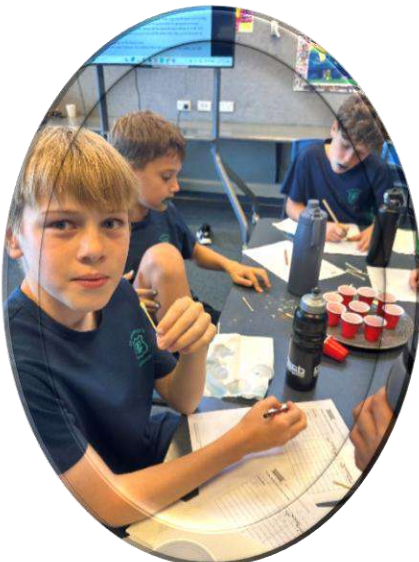
